The Home/School Connection is a way for parents to stay informed while having an interesting conversation with you and YOU get to rethink what you have been thinking about and learn more about your parents. So, it's great all around. As the year goes on, you will become better able to give supporting details and a real flavor for what has been happening in our 5th grade class. If you read, what I just wrote, underline the word flavor.

• DURING SCHOOL: Read and discuss the HSC with a classmate or teacher Notice the first page has longer descriptions. Please discuss all four (4) of the questions on the first page.

•	The 2nd page has 9 topics. Discus at least 3 of them. More is fine.
	GETTING TO KNOW YOUR NEW CLASSROOM: What do you like about our room? What makes it cozy or a good place to learn? Perhaps talk about the couch, trail chairs, rivertable, rocking chairs or our lamps. Ask your parents what kind of lighting they prefer. Explain who Tabitha, Reggie, Betty, Hubert, Glen, and Fred are. Explain the wolf/elephant posters such as: what can you understand if there are no words? Do you think the environment you're in affects the work you do? Ask your parents if they feel they work better in some places rather than others.
<u>_</u>	MEETING: Why do you think we have a headline story and meetings? Show your parent the attached list of jobs and describe some of them. We haven't learned about all of them yet. Ask your parents about different jobs they have had in their life. Which ones were better than others and why?
	TEAMS/POINTS: We are going to study birds this year. That is why your current teams are named by different bird groups. Who is on your team? What's it called? Here is an African proverb: "If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together." How does this quote connect to why you sit in teams? Ask your parents about how collaboration (working with others) has made a difference in their work or other parts of their life.
☐ IF YOU WERE IN MY SHOES: You are creating a poster about what it is like to be in you	
	shoes. Getting in someone else's shoes is called EMPATHY. It means feeling what someone else is going through. Why do you think it is important for other people in our class to know what it's like to be in your shoes, and why do you think you should know about them? You had to brainstorm ideas such as what makes you grumpy or what makes you feel better. Some of you wrote about things you wish for or feel good about. Ask your parents how they would answer those questions or other ones you thought about.
